Our mission is to offer a tailored therapeutic care experience that supports the unique needs of our service users as they transition into adulthood, and equip them with the knowledge, skills and confidence to be as independent as possible.

Specialists in Therapeutic Care

At Sinon House Therapeutic Unit, we provide a high level of therapeutic care to service users aged 16-31 years of age, with a practitioner on-site 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our team of therapeutic practitioners are experienced in dealing with a range of complex and challenging behaviours, including but not limited to autism, mental health issues, personality disorders, ADHD and learning disabilities.

Our care is delivered by a multidisciplinary team led by our Clinical Director, Dr Olyedemi who has an extensive background working with children, adolescents and adults. Dr Olyedemi oversees the review and assessment of every referral. The day-to-day care and support is delivered by our team of therapeutic practitioners led by Basil Baby, our registered home manager. All our therapeutic practitioners have a minimum of a Level 3 Diploma in Health & Social Care and have been provided with therapeutic care training - this further demonstrates our commitment to providing a high quality of therapeutic care.

Sinon House Therapeutic Unit can provide care and support for those individuals with challenging and complex needs through our dedicated therapeutic practitioner team and we can also accept individuals who are on a DoLS (Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards).

Our Therapeutic Approach

Our approach to therapeutic care is inspired by the work of John Bowlby & Donald Winnicott particularly their insights surrounding attachment theory & psychodynamic therapy. Within Sinon House Therapeutic Unit, we apply Bowlby's attachment theory by ensuring that all our service users experience a nurturing environment where they can form secure, positive attachments with compassionate caregivers. Our practitioners are also trained in Trauma Informed Practice enabling us to support our service users in their emotional development. This approach not only helps them in healing from past traumas but also in building a resilient foundation for emotional and social growth. Through this lens, we see our role not just as caregivers but as pivotal figures in shaping the developmental progress of the service users we care for.

Psychodynamic therapy forms a critical part of our therapeutic approach at Independence Development Ltd. This form of therapy emphasizes understanding the deep-seated feelings and past experiences that influence current behaviour. Winnicott believed that a nurturing environment is essential for healthy development, and for this reason Sinon House Therapeutic Unit has been purposely designed to feel as homely as possible.



Other Key Philosophies & Therapeutic Tools

Trauma Informed Practice

We often receive service users who have experienced trauma at some point, so we use Trauma-Informed Practice which places emphasis on trust, young people's safety, safe environment, peer support, empowerment and sensitivity to facilitate healing.

CBT

Cognitive Behaviour Therapy is used to explore the relationship between the thoughts, feelings and behaviours of our service users, to make them more aware of their triggers and actions. CBT can result in lower levels of anxiety, "happier" outlook on life and increased self control.

Containment Theory

Containment Theory dictates that the "container" – usually a key person in the young person's life (in this context IDL practitioners), are able to acknowledge and accept a young person's distress and makes experiences safe for them

Reflective Practice

It is important that practitioners maintain detailed and accurate information regarding the service users in our care between practitioners and other relevant stakeholders. We do this through regular team meetings focused on our service users.



Referral Process

Step 1: Contact Us

Via telephone, email or filling out form on our

Step 2: Visit Us

We'll then organise a tour of the home for you with the homes manager.

Step 3: Suitability

Both parties have the opportunity to decide if home is suitable.

Our Referral Criteria

Sinon House Therapeutic Unit is an inclusive environment and we are passionate about making real change in the lives of our young people, we believe every young person has the right to experience happiness. We have gained a reputation for not giving up on even the most challenging cases. So if you have a young person with a history of placement breakdowns - Sinon House could be the right place for them.


Our Pathway of Care
